Caring for Children... a Community Responsibility

Message from the Executive Director

This last year has seen unprecedented changes unfolding within the child welfare sector, all of which have significantly impacted the Society.

Provincially, the field has proactively responded to multiple initiatives, including pending legislative changes, the Motherisk Commission, Inquest recommendations, Authorization training for new employees, residential and adoption service reviews, and renewed emphasis on outcome measures.

Locally, the Society has supported the work of the sector by being an early adopter of Authorization training and embracing Shared Services, the latter a joint initiative of the Ministries of Children and Youth Services and Government and Consumer Services designed to build sector capacity, improve service quality, reduce costs and enhance equity.

The Society is also implementing the Child Protection Information Network (CPIN), a dedicated child welfare database linking child welfare agencies thereby enhancing child safety and eliminating administrative barriers to data sharing. The investment in both human and financial capital has been taxing with the Society having to enhance its staffing complement in order to resource its employees through implementation. While appreciative of the available Ministry of Children and Youth Services funding, the real costs associated with implementation and maintenance of the platform far exceed the allocation. Juxtaposed against the mandatory Accountability Agreement, the Society will experience significant pressures within its 2017/2018 operating budget.

Following an extensive review the Society is also in the process of transitioning its service delivery model as part of its ongoing commitment to provide high quality and responsive services to the community. Beginning in September 2017, services will be fully integrated, resulting in all front line services being pooled within discrete teams. This harmonization should ensure greater consistency, enhanced communication and decision making, all of which will provide better outcomes for service recipients and our substitute caregivers.

The Society has also been extremely fortunate to be guided by a dedicated and committed Board of Directors. A special acknowledgement to the Board Executive, and to our most recent members Mr. John Clack, Ms. Helen Eaton, Mr. Jim Howie, Ms. Miriam Cohen and Ms. Katie Speziale. The Society would also like to extend its best wishes to outgoing Board members, Mr. David Tranter, Ms. Mara Izzo and Ms. Dyann (Bert) Kreps for their respective nine year dedication to the organization and the children, youth and families of our community.

The organization also underwent significant change in 2016 with the retirement of Executive Director, Mr. Rob Richardson. The strength of the

organization's commitment to the lives of children, youth and families and the strong organizational culture is a testament to the work of Mr. Richardson, under whose tutelage the Society has achieved tremendous stability and respect in the community.

The Board wishes to acknowledge and thank Mr. Brad Bain for his leadership this year. We have been extremely lucky that Brad has joined us as Executive Director, and both the Board and the Society have benefited from his broad experience, his expertise and his commitment to the welfare of children.

The Society and Board also acknowledge the commitment of staff, volunteers and our foster, kinship and adoptive parents who pledge themselves to bettering the lives of children, youth and families. It is through these committed individuals that the Society achieves its Vision, Mission and Values of protecting and enhancing the lives of children.

The Society and Board also wish to thank the Jump Start Program backed by Canadian Tire for their generous donation of \$9,313.00 in support of children, youth, and families in Thunder Bay.

We also thank our community colleagues, Dilico Anishinabek Family Care, the City of Thunder Bay and the Ministries of Children and Youth Services and Community and Social Services for their partnerships in supporting the important work of the Society.
