## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The demands and uncertain economic times which the child welfare sector and the Children's Aid Society of the District of Thunder Bay are experiencing, create unique challenges for both the field and agency. Unfortunately, these challenges have resulted in organizational right sizing impacting staff complement and programming.

Over the past year, the Society continued to advocate on behalf of and support the work of the sector by participating on multiple service initiatives including but not limited to the Ontario Association of Children's Aid Society's Strategic Councils and the Shared Services initiative. The organization is also active locally through participation on multiple committees and work groups.

A commitment that is synonymous with the organization's engagement is the Northern Strategy, a proposed response in partnership with other child welfare organizations and local service providers to bridge gaps and enhance local service delivery to children, youth and families.

The Society also ratified a four year collective agreement with CUPE Local 2296 ensuring a continuation of uninterrupted service delivery to our community.

Provincially, the field has responded to multiple initiatives, including an expansion of the child welfare mandate and introduction of the *Child, Youth and Family Services Act.* The Society has also experienced significant economic pressures all of which are occurring within a climate of potential sector reconfiguration.

The Society is fortunate to be guided by a dedicated and committed Board of Directors. A special acknowledgement to the Board Executive and in particular President Mr. Roger Lepage, who has been instrumental in guiding the Board through significant economic pressures and the revitalization of Governance By-Laws and Strategic Planning.

The Society would also like to extend its best wishes to outgoing Board member and Treasurer, Ms. Katie Speziale and acknowledge her dedication to both the organization and to the children, youth and families of our community.

The Society and Board acknowledge the commitment of staff, volunteers and our foster, kinship and adoptive parents who dedicate themselves to bettering the lives of our community's children, youth and families. It is through these committed individuals that the Society operationalizes its Vision and Mission statements.

We also thank our community colleagues, Dilico Anishinabek Family Care, Tikinagan Child and Family Services, the City of Thunder Bay and the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services for their partnerships in supporting the important work of the Society.

## Saves MATTer

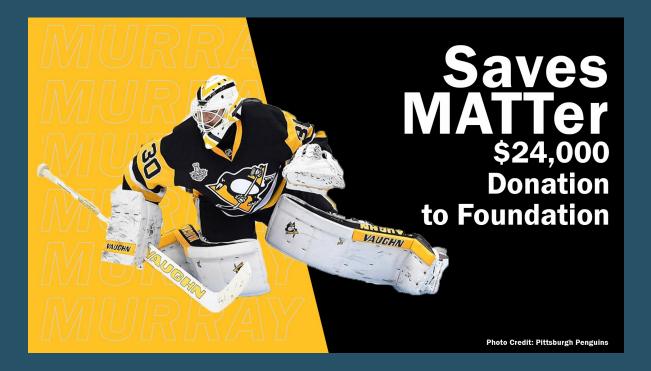
The Children's Aid Society of the District of Thunder Bay and its Foundation were honoured to be named as a beneficiary of Saves MATTer.
