2019 Summer Employment Opportunity Summer Caseworker Assistant – Thunder Bay

Full-Time Summer Employment for 8 Weeks • Monday to Friday (days) • \$18.00 an hour

These positions provide assistance to caseworkers during the summer months. Duties may include: Providing therapeutic support to children, youth and caregivers in their homes; linking children, families and youth to community resources; providing support to children and youth in care; supporting foster families; facilitating and supervising access visits between children in the care of the Society and their families.

Qualifications

- Degree, diploma or current enrollment in a social work, social service or child and youth care post-secondary program, or related human services program
- Demonstrated ability to develop helping relationships with children, youth and families
- Excellent communication, interpersonal and problem solving skills
- Demonstrated ability to work independently; comfortable working with families in their homes
- Organized, energetic

Job Requirements

- Valid "G" Driver's License and safe driving record (i.e., no more than two driving offences in the past three year period, and/or no more than five demerit points)
- Access to a personal vehicle and proof of one million dollar liability insurance coverage
- Criminal Records Check – Vulnerable Sector deemed satisfactory to the Employer, dated no earlier than May 25, 2019
